Course content				
Lectures	1. The origins and emergence of Christian divine services as well as the development of the divine services in chronological steps. 2. Theoretical and practical study of the divine services of the Byzantine rite. 3. Theoretical and practical familiarization with other liturgical rites. 4. An elaboration on theological views concerning the meaning of worship as it pertains to the notion relationship, especially between God and man and God and creation. 5. Exposition of theological positions on the divine services as pertains to problems of liturgical time and space. 6. Explanation of the liturgical meaning of individual parts of the Divine Liturgy. 7. Examination of general sacramental theology as well as the theology of the individual sacraments. 8. Examination of the emergence and development of the rites of the various divine services of the Church. 9. Theoretical and practical introduction to the liturgical order of individual services and rites.			
Practical classes (exercises, additional forms of classes, research work)	The same thematic units in their applied forms (with an insistence on qualified analysis of relevant texts, synchronous, diachronous, and confrontational observation and summary of liturgical concepts and elements, along with active and productive usage of literature dealing with liturgy, teleturgy, and liturgical theology. Introduction to different perspectives and elements of Christian divine services and active participation in liturgical services. Independent research of particular liturgical aspects. Due to the specific nature of the Faculty, the teaching structure, on the basis of the Statute, includes two different fields of study, pastoral-catechetical and practical-liturgical praxis.
