Lectures	Students will explore liturgical theology of the Orthodox (Afanasjev N., A. Schmemmann, A. Pentkovski, J. Fundulis, A. Jevtić et al.) and the Roman Catholic Church (R. Taft, M. Arantz, H. Mateos, E. Maza, E. Kavana, etc.). By analyzing individual authors and their theology, mutual impacts and interlacing of liturgical theology of the East and the West, we will try to find out the reasons that led to the boom of this discipline in 20/21 century, its results and achievements, its paths the meanderings, goals and capacities.			
Practical classes (exercises, additional forms of classes, research work)	Practical classes will be conducted in the divine service spaces of the Orthodox Church and other Christian churches and religious communities. This will make it possible for the students to observe and analyze on-site those peculiarities and differences that affect the formation of characteristic attitudes and principles of the corresponding liturgical theologies.
