Theoretical and practical introduction to the Christian temple, sacred vessels and vestments, liturgical books, as well as the common characteristics of different forms of worship. 4. Sources of Christian divine worship. 5. Sources of Liturgics.		
Practical classes (exercises, additional forms of classes, research work)	Same thematic units in their applicative embodiment (while insisting on developing skills for a qualified analysis of relevant sources, the synchronic, diachronic and confrontational observation and generalization of worshiping occurrences and elements, and the skills for an active and productive use of liturgical literature, Teletourgics and Liturgical theology). Getting to know the various aspects and elements of Christian divine worship by active participation in liturgical activities. Independent enactment of individual liturgical units. Special forms of lecturing, pastoral-catechetical, and practical-liturgical practice are also represented.
