<b>Learning outcomes</b>	Having mastered the skills of academic language in narrow field of studies, a student should be trained for written and oral reception and production in professional sphere of communication, according to international standards B2-B2+, as well as for comprehension and translation of scientific text and theological literature, with the use of dictionary.
